**Habitat of Montgomery County dedicates another home in Upper Dublin
on Sunday, November 22, 3 p.m. at
203 Linden Ave., North Hills, Upper Dublin (19038)**

Home sponsored by Episcopal Unity Build

Habitat for Humanity Montgomery County's (HFHMC) invites the community to attend the dedication ceremony on Sunday, November 22 at 3 p.m. at 203 Linden Avenue, North Hills, Upper Dublin. The community is invited to celebrate as the partner family, which includes three children, begins the move into their new Habitat home in time for Thanksgiving. The house is part of a 7-home project build on Linden Ave., located between E. Penna. Ave. and Limekiln Pike, North Hills.

The 203 Linden Ave. home is possible through a partnership with 13 Episcopal churches as part of the Montgomery County Deanery.

“Our staff and volunteers are pleased that this home is being dedicated during this traditional family holiday,” said Brenda Egolf-Fox, Executive Director, HFHMC. “It’s a heartwarming experience. Ultimately, the seven homes in Upper Dublin will provide much needed affordable housing to our qualified partner families.”

Two years ago HFHMC constructed its first Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) home on Linden Avenue in the North Hills neighborhood of Upper Dublin. While there, staff and board members learned that there were several other parcels of land available for construction on the same street.

Habitat’s mission is to eliminate poverty housing. In partnership with caring individuals and organizations, Habitat constructs simple, decent, affordable homes and empowers hardworking, low-income families to become homeowners by providing no-interest mortgages. Through orientation and application sessions, HFHMC screens prospective homeowners to ensure a smooth transition into owning a home. Since 1989, Habitat of Montgomery County has completed 46 homes in Montgomery County providing permanent housing for deserving families.
